QK Youth Advisors

QK Youth Advisors have been working with a range of students from Years 7-11 and students have valued this work enormously. They are part of the Extended School Youth team and are managed by the Youth Managers. A main part of their role is to work with students to help develop positive relationships in school and to support their academic progress. Due to the positive impact from the Extended School Youth Advisor Team and within the QK community we will be expanding the team from September 2009. The Youth Advisors have been involved with the behaviour and academic mentoring programmes, lunch time activities and the after school Youth Programme.
